



HONEY RUN TRAIL AT LAKE OF THE OZARKS STATE PARK

**GROUP WORK DAY
MAY 20-21-22, 2005**

ERTA and local trail builders in Osage Beach have been hard at work laying out trails for the second group workday. We hope to finish the trail this weekend, so we hope you can join us. Most of the work this weekend will be benchcutting and final trail prep. It will be a lot of hard work, but we are going to try to make it fun. We will most definitely be using the **Dingo's**, so come see what mechanized trail building is like.



HAPPY HOUR

We'll be holed up at **Pickled Pete's**, at 5726 Hwy 54, Osage Beach. After we've had a chance to shower and change, we'll be meeting at **Pickled Pete's** for refreshments.

The **go-cart tracks** should be open, so a few people may plan to 'hit the track' before grabbing a brew (or before we go home Sunday).

FOOD

We have worked out a deal with **The Daily News Café** (1046 Main Street, Osage Beach) to have deli sandwiches catered to the site for **\$5 per person**. They are good deli sandwiches, and they come with a cookie and a pickle. Please try to have the \$5 with you.

The Daily News Café will also be bringing **fresh coffee** out to the work site in the morning (\$1.25/cup or (\$1.00 if you have your own cup)

LODGING

HOTEL

We have a special "friends" room rate of \$69 at **Tan-Tar-A Resort**. Call 573-348-8554 and ask to speak to Gayla. Directions: Go south/west on Hwy 54 thru Osage Beach to State Road KK, then north (right) 3 miles to Tan-Tar-A entrance. www.tan-tar-a.com

CAMPING

There is pretty nice primitive camping just up the road from the work day. To get to it, go 5.7 miles north on McCubbins Drive from Hwy A. There are about 10 camping spaces with gravel drive-ins and fire rings. There is also a pit toilet building.

For more private camping, there is a small camping area called Passover. To get there, go 3.5 mi north on McCubbins Drive from Hwy A, to the Passover turnout. The camping area is 0.2 mi northeast. There are no designated camp spots, but there is a pit toilet, and a great view of the lake.

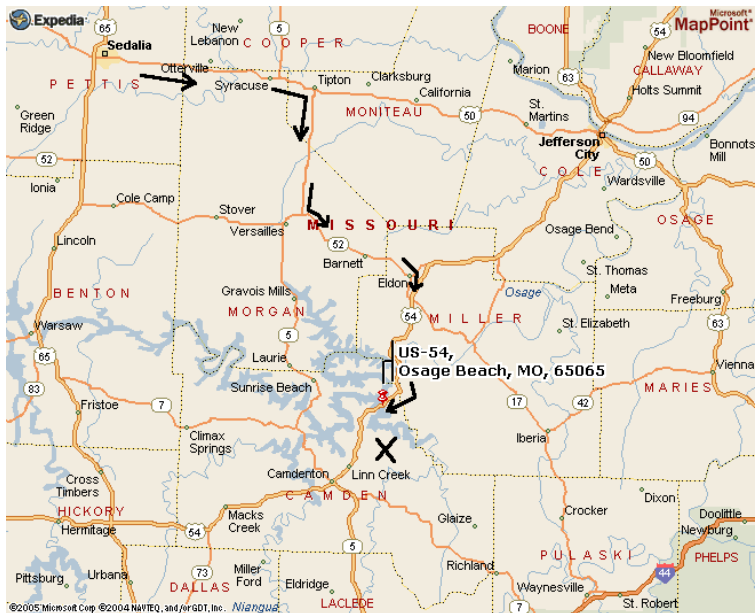
Saturday

How to get to Osage Beach:

From Kansas City: Take Hwy 50 east to Tipton. At Tipton, take Hwy 5 south to Hwy 52 east. At Eldon, take Bus 54 west to Hwy 54 west to Osage Beach.

How to get to the work site from Osage Beach:

From Osage Beach, take Hwy 54 west approx 5 mi south of town. Turn left (east) on Hwy A. Go approx 6.5 mi east on A to McCubbins Drive. Go 2.2 miles north on McCubbins Drive to Anderson Hollow Rd. Go approx 1.3 miles west on Anderson Hollow Rd. to the low water crossings. We will be staging all trail work from this location.

Our work area is shown to the right in green. The new trail is shown in red.
